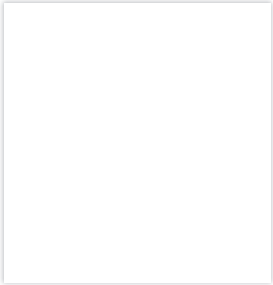
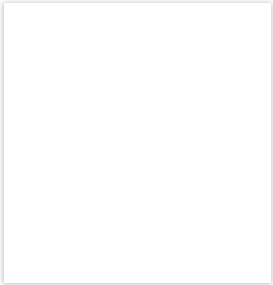

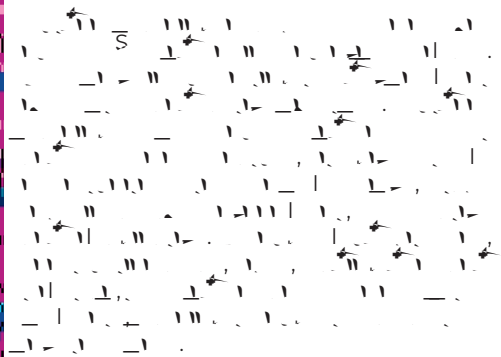

EYFS | What do we learn?

Children learn through play and exploration. They learn to communicate, to work with others, to solve problems and to understand the world around them. They learn to be confident and to take risks. They learn to be resilient and to persevere. They learn to be curious and to ask questions. They learn to be creative and to think for themselves.

Children learn to be happy and to enjoy themselves. They learn to be healthy and to take care of themselves. They learn to be kind and to respect others. They learn to be responsible and to follow rules. They learn to be brave and to face challenges. They learn to be confident and to believe in themselves.

All children learn at their own pace and in their own way. We support each child to reach their full potential. We provide a safe and secure environment where children can learn and grow. We encourage children to be active and to explore their world. We provide a range of activities and experiences that challenge and engage children. We work in partnership with parents and carers to support children's learning and development.

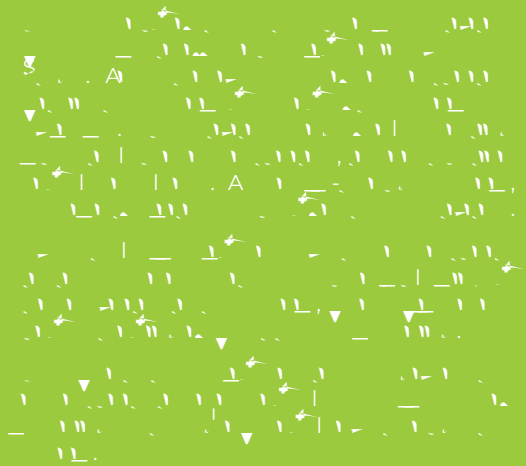

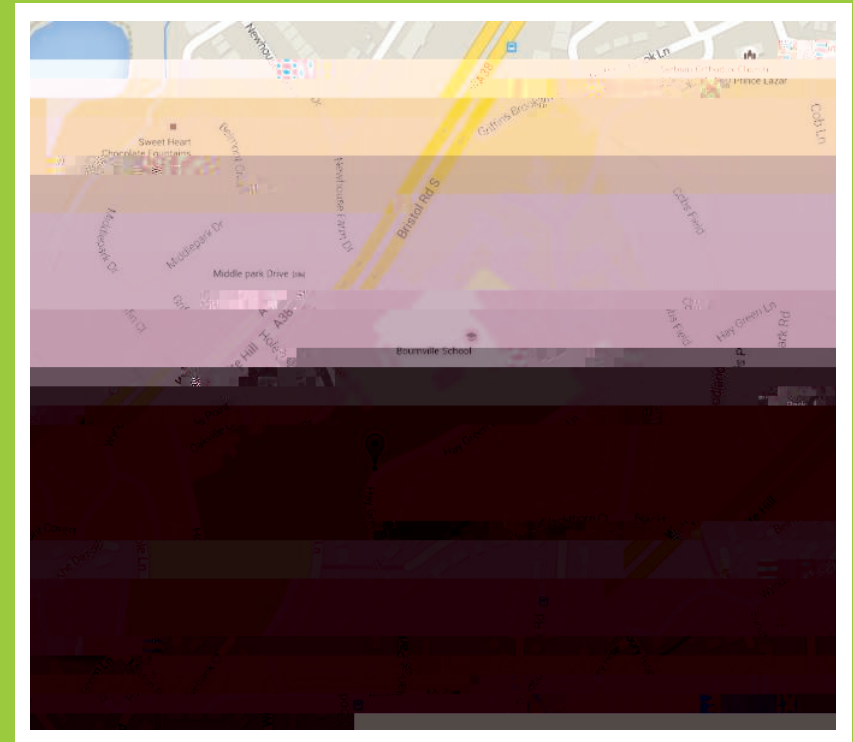
